Saskatchewan Quarterly Population Report

Third Quarter 2007

TOTAL POPULATION

Saskatchewan's population was estimated to be 1,003,299 as of October 1, 2007, according to Statistics Canada. This is an increase of 6,430 persons since July 1, 2007, and an increase of 15,263 persons from October 1, 2006. The third quarter (July 1 – September 30) saw Saskatchewan population rise 0.65 per cent during the quarter, the highest of all the provinces and territories.

Table 1 shows the quarterly population estimates and growth rates for Saskatchewan, Manitoba and Alberta over the past two years.

Saskatchewan's annual population growth rate was the second highest of all the provinces. Alberta had the largest growth rates among all provinces. Table 2 shows the October 1, 2007 population estimates for all provinces and territories along with their quarterly and annual growth rates.

NATURAL INCREASE

Saskatchewan had 3,154 births and 2,223 deaths during the third quarter of 2007 for a natural increase of 931. The natural increase over the same time period last year was 900.

MIGRATION

Interprovincial migration is the largest component of population change in Saskatchewan. Preliminary data suggests that in the third quarter of this year, 10,403 residents moved to Saskatchewan as 6,079 people left the province. The net interprovincial gain of 4,324 is 1,617 more than the second quarter of 2007 and 5,106 more than the third quarter of 2006.

For the fourth consecutive quarter, Saskatchewan was net recipient a interprovincial migrants from Alberta (net increase of 3,362 persons). Saskatchewan also had the highest net migration rate of the Table 3 provides origin and provinces. destination flows of interprovincial migrants for the July 1 to September 30 period.
