Saskatchewan Project List Summary with Total Project Costs

Town of Balcarres	
Arena Upgrades	\$137,298

This project will extend the life and improve energy efficiency of the Town of Balcarres arena. This includes resurfacing of the roof, installation a Low E ceiling and tank-less water heater, replacement of stand heaters, and the installation of capacitors in the ice plant room. A total of 90 person months of work will be created.

Beechy Community Association	
Arena Upgrades	\$165,855

This project will replace the boards at the Town of Beechy arena, create a wheelchair accessible concrete entryway, and install a wheelchair platform lift. The project will also improve dressing room cleanliness and safety with the installation of new non-slip rubber flooring. A total of 30 person months of work will be created.



Town of Creighton
Arena Upgrades

This project will replace the sprinkler fire suppression system at the Town of Creighton arena in order to improve public safety. It will also replace the brine heater system for ice and snow melt. Energy efficiency will be improved by insulating the facility. The project will create and maintain 67 person months of work.

Rural Municipality of Estevan No.5	
Sports Field and Walking/Jogging Track Improvement	\$100,000

This project will improve the football/soccer field and rehabilitate the walking/jogging track that encircles the playing field at Woodlawn Regional Park in the Rural Municipality of Estevan No.5. The project will include additions and enhancements to existing locker rooms. A total of 50 person months of work will be created.

Village of Frontier	
Arena Rehabilitation	

This project will rehabilitate the Village of Frontier arena. This includes the replacement of the existing boards and bleachers, and the addition of a cement floor. These upgrades will improve safety, and allow the arena to remain open year round rather than for the winter season only. The cement floor will improve the ability to make ice and therefore increase energy efficiency and water usage. This project will create 51 person months of work.

Town of Ituna Swimming Pool Upgrades

This project involves removal of the unsound surface of the Town of Ituna swimming pool. The surface will be repaired and resurfaced with an epoxy. The project also includes the installation of 24 solar heating panels to heat pool water. This will improve safety and energy efficiency. A total of 19 person months of work will be created.

Town of Kamsack	
Arena Green Upgrades	\$717,011

This project is an energy upgrade for the Town of Kamsack arena and will substantially lower annual utility costs. It will upgrade the lighting system to energy efficient lighting, and will replace the conventional heating and refrigeration system with a geothermal system that will provide heating and cooling power for the arena. These upgrades are expected to lower utility bills by 50 - 75%. This project will create 15 person months of work.

Town of Martensville	
Kinsmen Park Development Upgrades	\$794,000

This project will develop the park located in the centre of the Town of Martensville. Upgrades include adding, paving and lighting of walking paths, stabilizing shorelines, and development of green space areas (including irrigation) for recreation, physical activity, and social interaction. This project will create 41 person months of work.

Village of Maryfield Arena Upgrades

This project involves upgrading the Village of Maryfield community arena. The improvements will focus on upgrading the existing washroom facilities in order to both modernize and improve accessibility for all persons. This project also improves insulation of the curling rink in order to increase energy efficiency and reduce operating costs. This project will create a total of 4 person months of work.

Village of Montmarte
Arena Upgrades

This project involves upgrading the Village of Montmartre arena. This includes roof upgrades and repair, renovation of the arena boards and the installation of plexiglass. The installation of energy efficient lighting and a 95% high-efficient furnace will reduce operating costs. This project will create a total of 54 person months of work.

City of Moose Jaw Outdoor Pool and Natatorium Upgrades

This project involves upgrading mechanical equipment to extend the life of the outdoor pool located in the City of Moose Jaw. This includes upgrading the exterior to preserve the structure, improve safety for patrons, and make the facility accessible for people with disabilities. This project will create a total of 12 person months of work.

Rural Municipality of Waverley Arena Upgrades

This project involves the construction of a new dressing room at the Hamlet of Glentworth arena in order to improve accessibility through the addition of wheelchair accessible washrooms. These improvements will address the need to provide accessible facilities to all patrons. This project will create a total of 12 person months of work.

Young Parks and Recreation Arena Rehabilitation and Repairs

This project will upgrade the Village of Young arena. Upgrades include emergency lighting, electrical, radiant heat, plumbing, and fire suppression system, thus improving safety and extending the life of the facility. It will create a total of 5 person months of work.

Village of Zenon Park New Recreational Facility Construction

This project involves the addition of an all-in-one recreational facility that accommodates both skating and curling ice surfaces in the Village of Zenon Park. This project will add to an existing facility in order to accommodate both ice surfaces. Completion of this project will reduce future operating costs while providing upgraded facilities to the community. This project will create a total of 260 person months of work.
