Board of Education of the Regina Roman Catholic Separate School Division No. 81 Saskatchewan (Regina)	\$3,500	Family literacy – focus on monthly reading and storytelling sessions with First Nation Elder at Sacred Heart Community School to engage Aboriginal Pre-K and Kindergarten families
Great Plains College (Kincaid)	\$30,000	Adult literacy – focus on Canadian Mennonites who speak Low German
Humboldt Regional Newcomer Center Inc. (Humboldt)	\$6,500	Family literacy – focus on immigrant families
Muskeg Lake (Marcelin)	\$47,700	Adult literacy – provide financial literacy programming for all adults on reserve
North West Regional College (North Battleford)	\$28,000	Adult literacy – focus on developing parents' skills for helping with their children's schoolwork
Prince Albert Literacy Network Inc. (Prince Albert)	\$45,000	Adult literacy – focus on training tutors to work with participants of Prince Albert Bridges program and the men's provincial Community Training Residence
Regina Early Learning Centre (Regina)	\$15,000	Family literacy – focus on developing and piloting dual language family literacy resources
Regina Public Library (Regina)	\$32,000	Family literacy – focus on engaging young mothers at Balfour and Scott child care centres, Heritage Community Association and The Gathering Place
Core Neighbourhood Youth Co-operative Ltd. (Saskatoon)	\$23,800	Family/adult literacy – focus on young Aboriginal fathers
Peter Ballantyne Cree Nation	\$48,000	Adult/workplace literacy – focus on developing workplace skills with First Nation adults
Regina and District Food Bank Inc. (Regina)	\$29,400	Adult literacy – focus on developing pre-employment skills of immigrants and connecting to potential employment opportunities
Cornerstone Family and Youth Centre Inc. (Carlyle)	\$5,200	Family literacy – focus on rural families
Witchehan Lake (Spiritwood)	\$34,500	Family literacy – development of a family literacy program on reserve
