2016-17 Budget Highlights Provincial Municipal Support

The 2016-17 Budget provides \$406.3M of direct provincial support to municipalities. This represents an increase of \$56.7M or 16.2 per cent from the 2015-16 Budget and \$164.4M or 67.9 per cent from the 2007-08 Budget.

Municipal revenue sharing accounts for the greatest portion of this funding at \$271.6M in 2016-17, an increase of \$6.4M or 2.4 per cent from the 2015-16 Budget. This is a record amount for revenue sharing and represents an increase of \$144.4M or 113.5 per cent from the 2007-08 Budget.

This funding includes only provincial funding to municipalities and therefore does not include the federal funding that flows through the Ministry of Government Relations to municipalities.

MUNICIPAL REVENUE SHARING

- Municipal Revenue Sharing (MRS) is based on 1.0 percentage point of Provincial Sales Tax (PST) revenue as reported in Public Accounts from two years prior.
- Total 2016-17 MRS funding is \$271.6M and will be allocated as follows:
 - \$174.6M, an increase of \$4.1M, to urban municipalities;
 - \$76.7M, an increase of \$1.8M, to rural municipalities; and,
 - \$20.3M, an increase of \$475K, to northern municipalities.

INFRASTRUCTURE

- The 2016-17 Budget includes \$83.8M in provincial support for municipal infrastructure, an increase of \$50.2M from the 2015-16 Budget. Highlights of that funding include:
 - \$21.4M for the provincial portion of the New Building Canada Fund; the total amount, including the federal portion, is \$28.4M (Government Relations);
 - \$25M for Regina's Stadium Project (Parks, Culture and Sport);
 - \$16M for the Municipal Roads Strategy (Highways and Infrastructure);
 - \$10M for the Saskatoon North Commuter Bridge (Government Relations);
 - \$7.7M for the Urban Connector Program (Highways and Infrastructure);
 - \$1.9M for the Strategic Partnership Program (Highways and Infrastructure);
 - \$1.3M for the Building Canada Fund Communities Component/Building Communities Program; and,
 - \$604K for the Saskatchewan Infrastructure Growth Initiative (Government Relations).


OTHER FUNDING

- The 2016-17 Budget includes \$50.8M in other funding for municipalities, an increase of \$78K from the 2015-16 Budget. Highlights of that funding include:
 - \$16.9M in policing grants (Corrections and Policing);
 - \$11.1M grant to Libraries (Education);
 - \$7.9M for Grants in Lieu of Taxes for municipalities and libraries (Government Relations);
 - \$5.5M in grant funding for Urban Parks (Parks, Culture and Sport and Advanced Education);
 - \$3.5M for the Transit Assistance for People with Disabilities Program (Government Relations);
 - \$1.8M for the Discount Bus Pass Program (Social Services);
 - \$1.7M for the Making Community Rinks More Affordable Grant which provides each municipally operated rink in the province with a \$2,500 annual operating grant (Parks, Culture and Sport);
 - \$1.2M for the Rural Physician Recruitment Incentive (Health);
 - \$700K for the Community Airports Partnership Program (Highways); and,
 - \$500K for Irrigation Bridge Rehabilitation (Agriculture).

DETAILS OF REVENUE SHARING

The following chart illustrates the growth in municipal revenue sharing grants since 2007-08. There has been a total of \$1.96 billion in unconditional funding over that period.

Also presented on this page, as a further illustration of Saskatchewan's growth, is the change in funding through revenue sharing to Saskatchewan's cities, including Martensville and Meadow Lake, which became cities in 2009, and Warman, which became a city in 2012.
