More than 250 decontaminations

were performed on watercraft that were not properly cleaned, drained or dried and were at risk of spreading aquatic invasive species.



450+ water samples from waterbodies
all across the province were tested
for AIS.

Invasive Fish



- Goldfish were removed from stormwater ponds.
- Koi were reported in Junction Reservoir.
- eDNA monitoring for Prussian carp was conducted in the Qu'Appelle River watershed and no detections of Prussian carp DNA were found.
- Prussian carp continued to be monitored for downstream spread in the South Saskatchewan River system.
